

## NCAA PRESENTATION FOR SOPHOMORE SPRING EXPO 2019

**Register** at [www.eligibilitycenter.org](http://www.eligibilitycenter.org)

- (Only Division I and Division II require this)
- Will need to have coach contact information from 8th grade to present.
- Division III colleges do not require eligibility registration. Their admission offices decide on admissibility and fit. There is a new Division III/Undecided profile page registration with no fee, but it is not necessary. We do not allow students to participate in **Signing Day as a Division III** athlete until they have been officially **admitted by the college**. Division III cannot give athletic scholarships, so signing day is just a picture and acknowledgement of their participation/plans to play at the collegiate level.

**Print a Division I and/or Division II Worksheet.** We will use this to keep track of your core courses and gpa.

Plan for **16 core courses**. Bullis School's list of approved core courses are listed on Academics page; click on Academic standards, then Division I; then on NCAA core courses tab under Grade 12. Our school code is 210955. Type in the name of your previous school if you have attended another high school.

**Convert Bullis gpa** to 4.0 scale. Each grade converts as follows:

90-100 = 4.0

80-89 = 3.0

70-79 = 2.0

60-69 = 1.0

Below 60 = 0

Since Bullis adds 5 points to Honors, AP and Capstone courses, students are already getting a bump in their gpa, so we follow the 4.0 grading scale upon conversion.

**2.3 is minimum gpa** to be a full qualifier; for Division I; **2.2 for Division II**; **2.0 minimum** then sliding scale for partial qualifier

**Use Sliding Scale** to determine **standardized test score** required for that gpa. For **SAT**, it is sum of Critical Reading and Math Scores. For **ACT**, it is sum of English, Math, Reading and Science. The Eligibility Center will take the best individual subscores from various test dates.

**Each time student registers for a standardized test**, they should have their score sent to the NCAA Eligibility Center. Their code is 9999. They keep the best individual score from each test date, so there is no risk to sending scores sight unseen. If student does not send scores at time of registration, they will need to send scores to the Eligibility Center directly from the testing center for a fee.

**The College Counseling Office** will send the **official transcript** at the end of the sophomore and junior year and will also send a **final transcript with proof of graduation** in mid-June of the graduation year.

\*\*\*If student has **transferred** from another high school, he/she will need to contact the **previous school** and ask them to send an official transcript to the Eligibility Center. All transcripts must be originals from each school. They will not accept a copy of the previous school transcript.\*\*\* Also, pay close attention to weighting of grades and grading scale.

If student has **reclassified**, only the first 8 semesters (at Bullis, first 12 trimesters) count towards NCAA Eligibility.

**Complete Amateur Eligibility** Questions. Final questionnaire cannot be completed prior to April of senior year.

If student is being recruited and needs **transcripts sent to coaches**, please email Ms. Kittel, Mr. Weisgold or Mrs. Brant and we will send transcript. It looks more official if coming from us and we usually add a few positive words of support along with the transcript.
