The PreACT is Coming Down the Pike!

Our sophomores will sit for the Bullis-administered PreACT on **Tuesday**, **February 20**. Here are some key details to be aware of for the day of the exam:

- All sophomores will eat during A lunch, beginning at 11:35 a.m.
- Sophomores with <u>no</u> testing accommodations will report to the Athletic Center at 12:05 p.m.
- The exam itself is approximately 2½ hours students should complete testing around 3:00 p.m.
- Students should bring a working calculator with batteries and sharpened #2 pencils

For those students who test **with ACT-approved accommodations**, the exam will be in the Studio Theatre of the Boarman Discovery Center. Please be in contact with Lisa Anzelone for more details.



Circling Back to College 101

The junior class had their first meeting with their college counselor for College 101. These sessions, which are MANDATORY for all juniors, share crucial information allowing students to gain an understanding of the college search process and begin college exploration without the pressure of imminent deadlines.

Our first session included transcript review, registration for CollegeBoard and ACT accounts, and a brief overview of Naviance. Juniors have been assigned a questionnaire, which upon completion will allow them to meet one-on-one with their individual counselor.

When to Start: A Timeline for Test Prep

Students and parents are always wondering when is the "right" time to test, which test is the "right" test to take, and how to best prepare. While we can tell you colleges and universities have **no preference** between the SAT or the ACT, much of the other answers as to the when-and-which of testing depend on the student.

Our goal for every student is that they've taken at least one standardized test before the end of the junior year. This will allow them to test over the summer and potentially one additional time as a senior before application deadlines.
