## What's Happening in College Counseling?

We've been hard at work with the seniors and their families navigating through the college application process. This past month we've had two parent coffees and many one-on-one meetings with our students. Additionally, students and counselors have had the opportunity to visit with <u>four to five colleges and universities each day</u> right here in the College Counseling Office. Teacher references and counselor recommendations are almost complete with deadlines quickly approaching. A list of those colleges visiting Bullis in October is listed on page 3 of this newsletter, on monitors throughout the school and in our office (North Hall, First Floor)!

## Financial Aid Forms - Finally Available!

Beginning October 1 both the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the CollegeBoard College Scholarship Service Profile (CSS Profile) will be available.

For seniors and their families, colleges and universities may require one or both of these completed forms before awarding any need-based aid.

Need-based aid includes awarded monies such as federal work study and/or student loans (to be paid back) in addition to other grants and scholarships (not to be paid back) based on demonstrated need. Need is determined by analyzing the information provided on forms such as the FAFSA and CSS Profile to generate what they believe is your Estimated Family Contribution (EFC). Colleges and universities then subtract your EFC from the Cost of Attendance in order to determine student need and eligibility. Keep in mind, Cost of Attendance is typically *more* than the billable charges (such as tuition, fees, room & board) and includes things like transportation, estimated book charges, and miscellaneous charges.

Usually, these forms are not required for students who are only looking for scholarships based on academic prowess, athletic or artistic performance and community engagement; however, each school has its own financial aid/merit scholarship application process.

### Notes from the National Conference

"Applying to college is not just a transaction, it is an experience"



Earlier in September, Mrs. Kittel and Ms. Martin had the opportunity to attend the National Conference for the National Association of College Admission Counselors (NACAC) in Boston. During their trip, they were able to visit surrounding schools and Bullis alumni at Harvard University; Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT); Northeastern University; and Tufts University.

Throughout the conference, attended by college counseling professionals *and* admission representatives, Mrs. Kittel and Ms. Martin were able to interact with many colleges and universities while in turn, those professionals learned a bit more about Bullis. Additionally, Mrs. Kittel and Ms. Martin attended receptions with schools in the Big 10, Big 12, and the Colleges that Change Lives (CTCL) just to name a few.

When not touring colleges, or learning more through receptions, college counselors attend sessions led by higher education professionals on topics like:

#### **New Trends in College Admissions:**

 Self-reporting grades and test scores – the University of California system has allowed self-reporting for decades finding a less than 1% false-reporting rate.
 Washington University, University of Chicago, Texas Christian University and University of Iowa have since adopted this style of reporting. More colleges may soon follow.

#### **An Update on the Common Application:**

- For this current admission cycle, there are 772 colleges and universities accepting the Common Application
- 6 universities are requiring students to self-report grades; Common App will alert you of this requirement
- For students to stay on top of their Common App, they've released a Common App on Track mobile app for phones and tablets

### December Drop-In Dates

While we will be spending the majority of our time with seniors in the fall, we recognize how important it is for us to get to know the rest of the students and families in the Upper School. For the first time, we will offer three days in December (Monday, December 4 – Wednesday, December 6) for families of freshman, sophomores, and juniors to drop-in and make introductions, ask questions, and learn how we work directly with students. ## Coming to College Counseling

This fall, we plan to host over 110 colleges and universities in College Counseling.
