### Circling Back to College 101

The junior class had their first group session followed by a small-group session held during their study halls for College 101. These sessions, which are **MANDATORY** for all juniors, share crucial information which allow students to gain an understanding of the college search process and begin exploration without the pressure of imminent deadlines.

In our first small group study hall sessions, students were introduced to our College Counseling timeline; taken through a brief overview of Naviance including how to research a college and how to interpret scattergrams; and had an introductory explanation of commonly-used admissions jargon. The juniors are working diligently on their questionnaires, which are **due on March 6** (found on Haiku). Upon completion, they can schedule their one-on-one meeting with their individual counselor.

As a reminder, students will receive emails from the counselor leading their College 101 sessions. The dates, times, and locations are also posted outside of the College Counseling office. For those students who do not have a study hall this trimester, our make-up session is scheduled for 3:00 p.m. on the Wednesday of the week the study hall sessions are held (February 12, March 11, and April 15).

We look forward to continuing our work with the Class of 2021 as they begin their course selection and college process.

## Pointers from a Pro for Juniors and Seniors

Juniors have just begun the college journey. Questions from friends and family about "where are you looking?" and "what are you looking for?" start to arise. Tulane University's Director of Admission, Jeff Schiffman's recent blog post, "Junior Tips Part I: Start Here," helps juniors ask themselves some big-picture questions. His best piece of advice: "There are roughly 2,600 universities and colleges around the US. None of them are bad schools, some of them might just be bad fits for you." Our College Counseling office aims to find the best-fit institution for each student.



Earlier this month, in the same blog, Schiffman also writes a post directed at seniors. In "How to Stay Admitted," he shares six common mistakes seniors make, which may put their admission in jeopardy. As we've stressed to the seniors, it's

important to maintain their grades, continue coming to school each day, and making good choices socially and on social media. Jeff reinforces the fact that "colleges are *never* looking for reasons to rescind your admission."

### **Positive Outcomes Continue!**

To date, our seniors have successfully submitted 1,270 applications! Most of our students who have applied through Early Decision, Restrictive Early Action, Early Action, and Rolling admission have received their decisions; 340 acceptances have been offered. Just this past weekend, University of Maryland and University of Virginia released their decisions.
